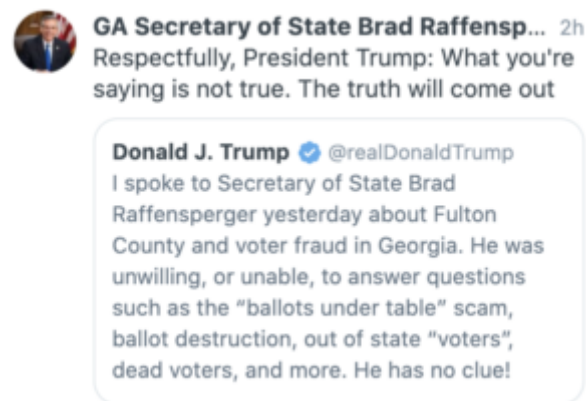


LORDY, THERE ARE TAPES
